Each triage pack needs (in gallon zip lock bag)

- 6-7 4" roller bandages
- 4-5 30"x30" triangular bandages


Washing Instructions

- 1. Wash sheets
- 2. Wash again in very hot water with bleach (according to package directions) with no detergent or fabric softener
- 3. Dry on hot in dryer
- 4. Fold and put in clean plastic bag

Cutting Instructions

- 1. Make sure the surface you are cutting on is clean!
- 2. Cut queen or king size sheets first. Cut queen or king size sheets into 4 triangular bandages and 4" wide roller bandages (see below). You should get approximately 10 bandages.
- 3. Cut smaller sheets. For smaller sheets, cut 4" roller bandages and/or triangular bandages, depending on need.
- 4. Roll bandages (and fold triangular bandages) and place in gallon zip lock bags.

Give to your Neighborhood Emergency Preparedness Director to put into neighborhood supplies.


